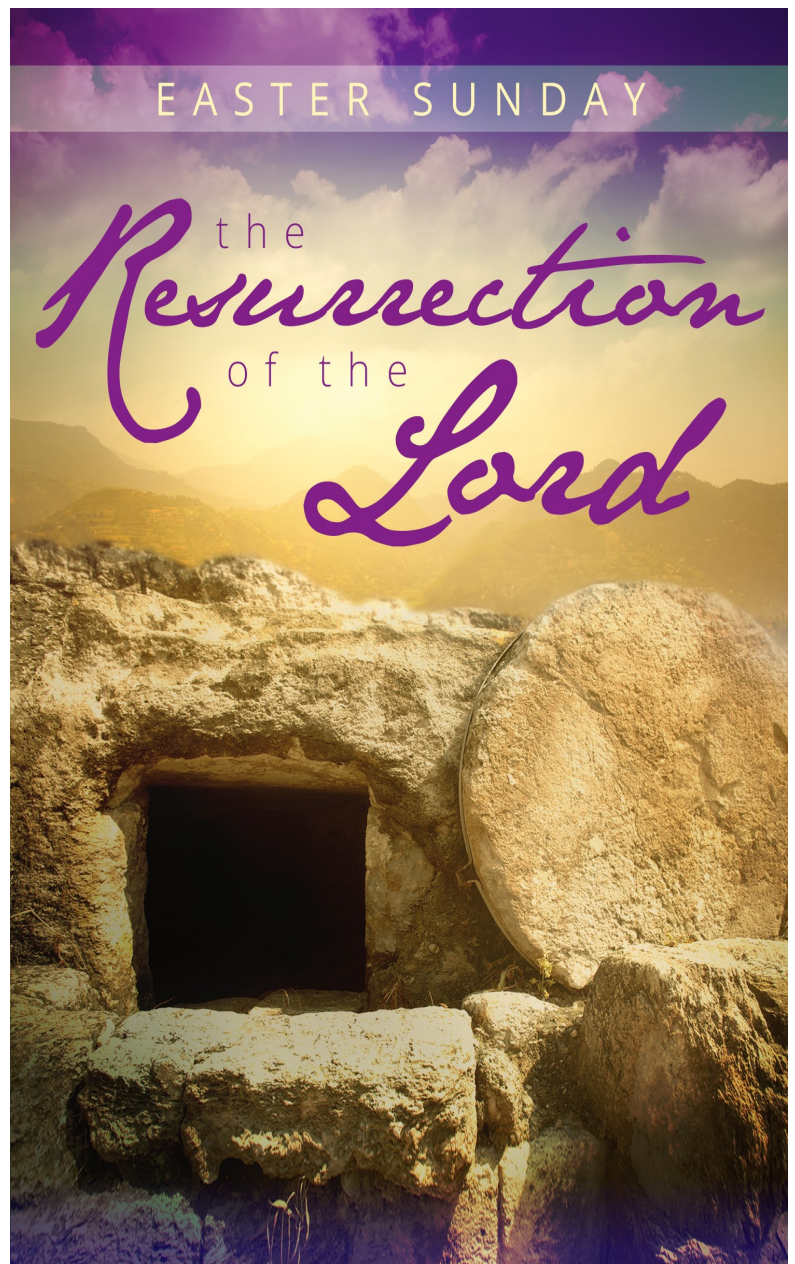

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

Happy Easter, one and all!

When I think back to my memories of Easter Sunday as a boy, I remember getting up super early to find my Easter basket cleverly hidden somewhere in the house. We then dressed in our Sunday best for Mass and my mother and sisters always had special corsages to wear. Then my mother would put on a spectacular meal at which some elderly family friends who lived alone usually joined us. I was certainly aware that the day wasn't about the Easter bunny, but about Christ's resurrection from the dead, though it wasn't something you really discussed or that I fully understood.

These past few months I've been reading a book called *The Resurrection of the Son of God* by N.T. Wright, an Anglican Bishop and scripture scholar. It was a short 738 pages long! It took me months to read over breakfast but it was very well worth it. He writes that "History matters because human beings matter; human beings matter because creation matters; creation matters because the creator matters. And the creator, according to some of the most ancient Jewish beliefs, grieved so much over creation gone wrong, over humankind in rebellion, over thorns and thistles and dust and death, that he planned from the beginning the way by which he would rescue his world, his creation, his history, from its tragic corruption and decay; the way, therefore, by which he would rescue his image-bearing creatures, the muddled and rebellious human beings."

He is speaking, of course about the resurrection of Jesus, which is not to be understood as some bizarre miracle, but as the beginning of the new creation. It all happened in the real world, in space, time, and matter. This radical act of God has deep implications for Christian engagement in the world. As N.T. Wright puts it, "And, however dangerous this may turn out to be, it is the real world in and for which Christians are committed to living and, where necessary, dying. Nothing less is demanded by the God of creation, the God of justice, the God revealed in and as the crucified and risen Jesus of Nazareth."

May God help us, his image-bearing creatures, to understand and live out this core mystery of our faith. The resurrection has deep implications for how we Christians are to live in a world so mired in oppression, injustice, and poverty. That is why we continually pray, "Thy kingdom come." And why we proclaim, with the disciples on that first Easter morn, that Christ is truly risen!
