HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE



"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. 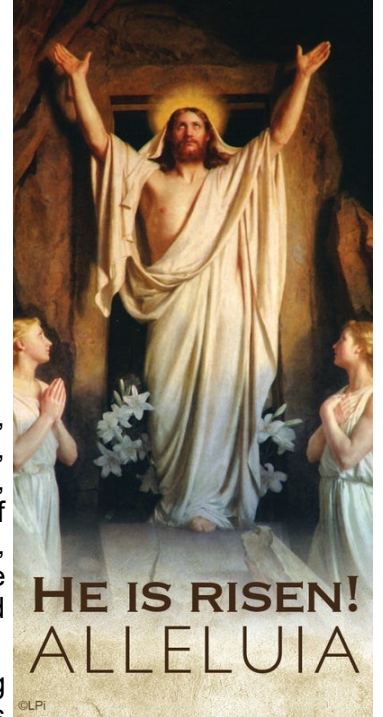

Fr. Cameron's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer Community,

This is the day the Lord has made! Let us rejoice and be glad in it! For on this day, the true pinnacle of our entire liturgical year as Catholics, Christ rose from the dead, and conquered the darkness of evil and sin, which brought death to our human race, originally destined by God for eternal life. In His infinite love, the Logos, the Son of God took on the worst of our sufferings and submitted himself to a shameful, torturous death. But now, in His Infinite Power, He emerged victorious from the grave. In glory, He has risen, has imparted his blessing upon us, the Church, and ascended in body and soul to His rightful place at God the Father's side in heaven.

This is the day the Lord has made! Let us rejoice and be glad! Because in celebrating Christ's resurrection on this feast of feasts, we are not just cheering on the sidelines for Christ's resurrection. **We celebrate that we too, have risen in Christ.**

This mystery ties back to Christmas and Christ's Incarnation. Perhaps some of us missed the chance to soak in this truth amid all the presents and family gatherings and carols and snowstorms back in late December. When the Word was made flesh, when the Son of God received from Mary a human body, He took on all of human nature, all of humanity to Himself. Precisely so that when this same Son underwent a sacrificial death of love, a descent to the grave, and a rising to new life, He could bring all of us with Him.

This is the day the Lord has made! Let us rejoice and be glad! Rejoice because from the mystery of the resurrection, Christ has imparted to us the gift of the Church and its sacraments, as a way for us all to receive and participate in the grace that poured forth from Christ's wounded side on the cross. We who have been baptized have shared in the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection. We who have been confirmed have been strengthened in the Spirit of God's Love. We who receive the Eucharist are nourished every Sunday by the grace of Jesus' self-offering to God for us, and are reminded of our call to offer our lives to God with him as a sacrifice of love. As St. Paul assures us, "You have died and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear in glory."

Let us rejoice and be glad, for all those throughout the world who were taken up into this mystery through baptism last night at the Easter Vigil. They are our newest brothers and sisters in Christ! Let us rejoice for all those who are soon to enter deeper into this mystery by receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation and first Holy Communion.

In our Holy Redeemer Community, we will not have any youth confirmations this Easter season, as all of our youths in this process of preparation are just finishing the first half of a two-year preparation process. However, we will celebrate together with Emily Shelton her Confirmation and First Communion. Having been baptized in the Anglican faith, she has undergone a journey of prayer and discernment that have led her to seek full communion with the Catholic Church. Her reception into Full Communion will take place at the **10am Mass on April 23rd**.

In addition, 12 children in our English-speaking community will receive their First Eucharist on **May 7th at the 10am Mass**, and 25 children in our Spanish-speaking community will do the same on **June 18th at the Noon Mass**. Let us rejoice and be glad for all those who are growing in Christ's love through a fuller participation in the Church's Sacramental life!
