Pastor's Message

Dear people of Holy Redeemer,

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament Thursdays, 4:30 - 7:30 pm.

Prior to the pandemic, the parish offered Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursdays, 7:45am through Benediction at 8:00pm. This prayer is an extension of the Mass that requires at least two people be in the church for prayer because when the Eucharist is exposed, someone must be in attendance. However, we kept finding that we didn't have enough people to cover this 12-hour span of time.

So, in order to sustain this time in prayer, we've opted to hold Adoration on Thursdays from 4:30pm and end with Benediction at 7:30pm. We invite you to come to the church during these three hours to spend some quiet time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament with other parishioners and to offer prayers for the needs of our parish and of our world.

As we contemplate the Lord in this sacramental presence, we allow Him to look upon us in love and to draw more closely into the mystery that we celebrate when we gather each week for Sunday Mass.

Liturgical Ministries for Sunday and Weekday Mass

As we continue to move beyond the restrictions of the past 16 months, Fr. Pat and I want to bring back the ministries that are needed for our celebrations of Mass. This is a good time to invite those who haven't been involved in a ministry to do so and also to gather each ministry group together so that we can re-establish uniform procedures, answer questions, and reflect on the Lord who calls us to serve the People of God when we gather in the Spirit as the Body of Christ.

For each of the following ministries, Fr. Pat and I would prefer that ministers be fully vaccinated. Of course, we will not ask your status but full vaccination is the safest for all concerned. For those who are interested in any of the following ministries, please contact Fr. Michael, rectory office.

Altar Servers - Boys and girls of registered parish families, 5th Grade and older, are invited to serve during Mass after appropriate instruction.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion - Those who are fully initiated Catholics and are at least 16 years old are invited to serve at Mass through the distribution of Communion. This includes those who wish to serve in **Ministry to the Homebound** by bringing Word and Communion to those who're at home or in nursing facilities and cannot come to Mass due to their age or illness.

Lectors - Those who are fully initiated Catholics and are at least 16 years old are invited to serve at Mass in proclamation of the Word.

Sacristans - Those who are interested in helping to prepare to set up for Masses and assist with the details of clean-up after Mass.

Ushers/Ministers of Hospitality - Those who are interested in welcoming people to church, overseeing practical details, and taking up the collection.

Thanks for your ongoing prayer and help as we emerge from the pandemic restrictions and celebrate more fully at Mass and other parish activities!
