These moms will have their babies and toddlers with them. Volunteers, as nannies, will make it possible for these young moms to hear the Good News and enjoy the camp.

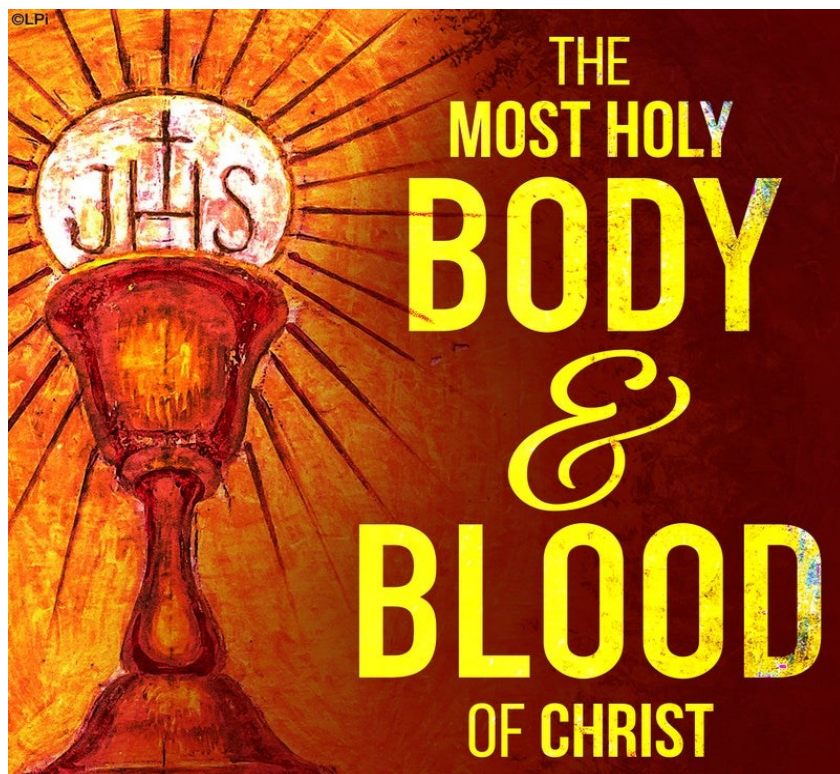

Fr. Cameron's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer Family,

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is a celebration of our Lord's real bodily presence in the sacrament of the Eucharist: a special Mass to draw our attention to the mystery that is present at every celebration of the Mass, the Lord's coming to be with us, in a bodily, physical way.

This celebration has its origins in Liège (Present-Day Belgium), where a pious woman named Juliana of Mont-Cornillon began to receive repeated visions at prayer, of a full-moon with a small gap in it. Eventually Christ visited her in one of these visions to explain the meaning of the vision: The moon represented the Church with all the brightness of its liturgical celebrations, but the gap represented a missing Feast that Christ desired for His Church to honor his Presence in the Sacred Eucharist, apart from Holy Thursday, in which the focus is more centered on Christ's Passion. Christ then commissioned her to be an advocate for this Feast.

While her efforts initially met with some resistance from clergy, Bishop Robert de Torote eventually welcomed the Feast and asked all parishes in his diocese to celebrate it on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. In much of the world it is still celebrated on that day, but within the United States, the Church instead marks this Solemnity of our Lord on the following Sunday. In 1264, Pope Urban VI, who had been an Arch-Deacon in Liège, issued a papal bill instituting Corpus Christi as a Feast for the entire Latin Church.

Within a century the practice of elaborate Eucharistic processions became common place, in which Jesus in the Eucharist was held aloft in a monstrance, covered in an ornate canopy, and followed by a train of people, often including the nobles and dignitaries of a locale, all in adoration of Christ's Real Presence. On this Sunday, the Holy Redeemer Community will have our own modest version of a Eucharistic Procession at 1:00 pm, immediately following the Spanish Mass.

As Catholics, we believe that the Eucharist is "the Source and Summit of our Faith." Source, because from our Communion with Christ, we receive spiritual nourishment and strength, that allows us to go forth and bring to the world the love we have received. Summit, because it is the high-point of a life that's directed towards our union with God. When we receive the Eucharist, even our bodies get to participate in God's indwelling in us, a mystery that will be perfected at the heavenly banquet.

May this day's celebration awaken our faith, our gratitude, and our love towards Jesus who comes to be with us in each offering of the Mass, in Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, all under the humble appearance of food and drink.

Please pray for the 24 children in our Holy Redeemer family who will make their First Communion next week during the Spanish Noon Mass!
