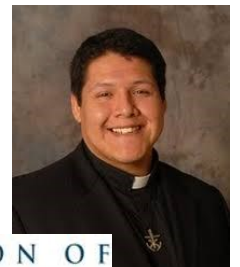

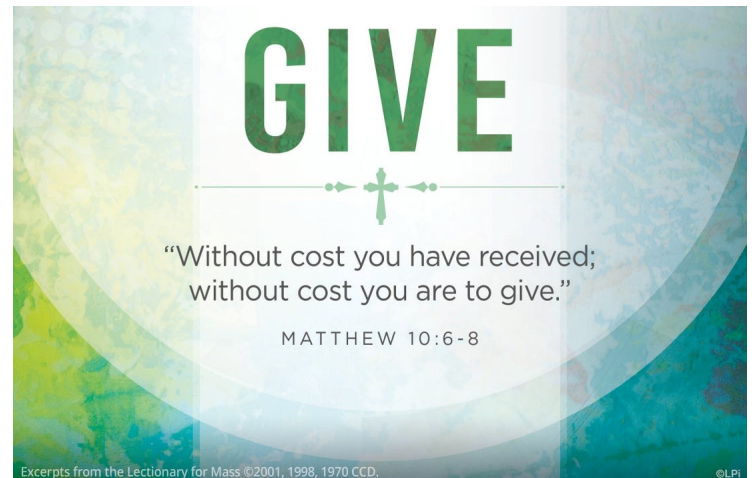

Each summer teen moms and their children head to camp to experience the gospel. This is possible because individuals & groups from around the country **GO** to spend a week caring for babies and children at camp.

Washington Family Ranch, the Young Life camp in Eastern Oregon, will be sharing the gospel with hundreds of teen mothers throughout Oregon (July 25-30). These moms will have their babies and toddlers with them. Volunteers, as nannies, will make it possible for these young moms to hear the Good News and enjoy the camp.

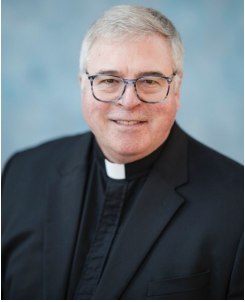
Trinity Classical Summer (rising 4-6th grades)
