### HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council [www.svdppdx.org](http://www.svdppdx.org). Meetings take place in the Rectory on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6:30 PM and by Zoom. All parishioners are invited, and volunteers are encouraged to attend. ## Pastor's Message

Dear people of Holy Redeemer parish,

One year ago, **Fr. Pat** was elected by the members of the US Province of Priests and Brothers of Holy Cross to serve as a delegate at the **General Chapter in Rome**. Holy Cross brothers and priests who were elected as delegates from Bangladesh, Canada, Chile, France, Haiti, India, Mexico, Peru, Tanzania, Uganda, and the USA will be present for the 3-week session. They will discern the future of our community, our ministries, our structure of governance, and our community life. Please keep Fr. Pat and all of them in prayer during these important meetings and discernment. And please let Fr. Cameron and I know if you need anything.

Last Sunday, at all Masses, Fr. Cameron and I instituted those parishioners who serve as **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMOHC)**. This is done on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, at the direction of our Archdiocese, and these individuals will serve at Mass or in bringing Communion to the Sick and the Homebound for the next three years. It's hard to know when we will be able to offer the Precious Blood again at Mass, so, many of these ministers are waiting to return to active ministry. However, we always have the elderly and those who are sick who appreciate visits and the Sacrament brought to them. So, please keep these liturgical ministers and those whom they serve in prayer.

**The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** also is one that we as priests offer to those who are elderly, sick, hospitalized, injured or near death. It is a sacrament of healing and strength and is a benefit to those who receive it as well as all of us who receive grace from God whenever a Sacrament is celebrated. If you or someone you know would benefit from a visit with Communion and the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, please do not hesitate to contact us at the rectory. As priests, we are often called upon to bring these Sacraments to people beyond our parish in hospitals, home or nursing care facilities.

A word to everyone about **Funeral Services**. The full Catholic Funeral includes three parts: (1) a Vigil Service of Scripture, Song and prayer with or without the Rosary, (2) a Catholic Funeral Mass followed by (3) a committal at the cemetery. If you desire a Catholic Funeral, please communicate this in writing and leave it with your lawyer. I have discovered that sometimes when an elderly person dies, their children and family who are not practicing their Faith choose not to have a Catholic Funeral or a Mass. I know this is important to all of us and I encourage you to request it from your family in writing. And if you'd like to plan your Funeral by selecting hymns and Scriptures, I would be happy to help you in that process.
