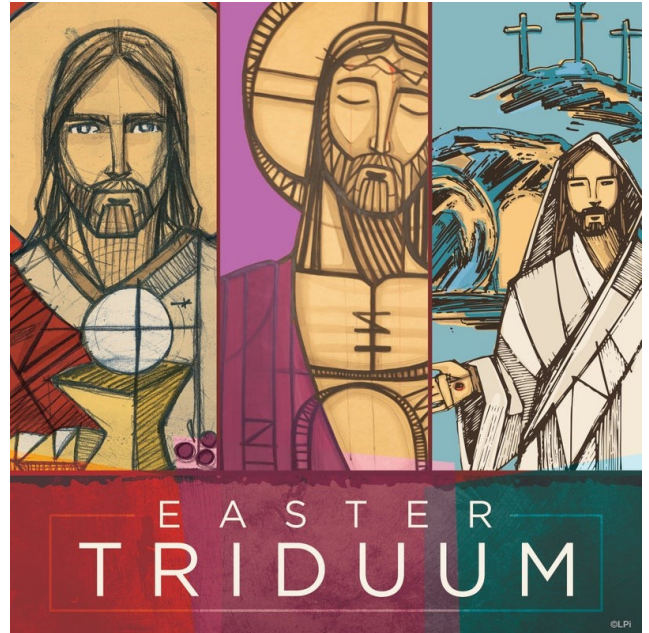

Fr. Paul's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer,

Palm Sunday presents us with two extremes. The crowds that call to Jesus, "Hosanna," ("Save us, we pray") will cry loudly for his death in barely five days' time. On this great holy day of preparation, this day that begins our Holy Week in the Church, we recall both of these moments: Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, and Christ's Passion and Death on the Cross.

The Passion stories that stand at the wellspring of the Gospel tradition, rich in mystical insight and narrative power, are proclaimed only twice each year. In our Gospel of Mark, the scripture from which we read from this Sunday, we hear rather vividly of Jesus' anguish in the garden and the most brutal aspects of the execution ritual (scourging, mocking, crowning with thorns). Yet Mark also writes from the viewpoint of Easter faith, which is rooted in the mystery of the Cross. The Cross is salvation, the mortification of Jesus is his exaltation (Philippians 2:6-11); the way of discipleship is the way of suffering and, while the called disciples flee, the proper confession of Jesus as Son of God is uttered by the Gentile centurion (Mark 15:39). Jesus dies with a cry, "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" (also found in Psalm 22:2), leaving us to wonder whether this is truly despair or an unfinished expression of grief that ends in triumphant faith (Ps. 22:23-32).

Though it is a week rich with biblical readings, Holy Week is also a time when we express the deepest mysteries of our faith by bodily movement. There are Palm Sunday processions, Stations of the Cross, the kissing of the cross and dramatic re-enactments of Jesus' journey to death. Our hope is that you will take advantage of the opportunities to participate in The Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, The Easter Vigil or Easter Sunday). The Passion of Jesus moves beyond words and takes hold of the feet and hands, the lips and hearts of individuals and entire communities in our Church. May this week be a time to listen deeply to the readings, to pray over them, to let them become part of our lives as we confront the mystery of suffering.
