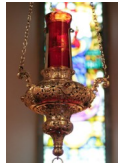

### **HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE :**

"Giving help and hope, etc...." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council [www.svdppdx.org](http://www.svdppdx.org). Meetings take place in the Rectory on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6:30 PM and by Zoom. All parishioners are invited, and volunteers are encouraged to attend. **FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH:** We have served 87 families with 3,600lbs. of food, \$3,000 in rent assistance and \$1,600 in utility assistance. Thank you for your ongoing sacrifices and love to support our community members in need.

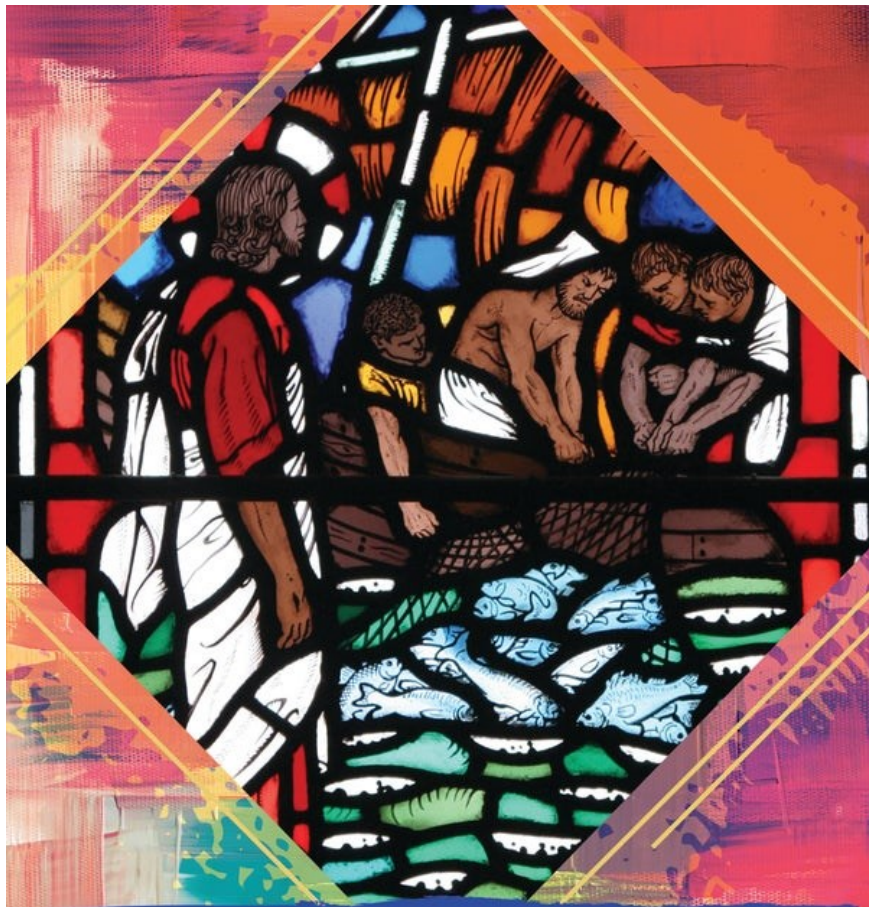

## Father Michael's Message

*Happy 3rd Sunday of Easter!*

Dear People of Holy Redeemer -

As you read the bulletin from one Sunday to the next, you have a sense of the life of our parish community. You read, for instance, the names of those who were recently Baptized; these newest members of the Catholic Church are our brothers and sisters, no matter whether or not we know them, their parents & families and no matter if they know us. We are bonded through the grace of Jesus Christ and the faith we share in Baptism.

Or ... you read the names of those who have died recently. We entrust them to the Lord since their earthly pilgrimage has ended and their Baptism is complete. We pray for their eternal rest and we intercede on behalf of their families and friends who mourn their deaths. We trust again in the grace of Jesus Christ and the life we share in our Baptism.

Or ... you read the names of those listed in the announcement of Mass prayer intentions. You get an idea of who is requesting prayers for a particular person or need and who are the intended recipients. One commendable benefit of our Catholic faith is that we intercede for everyone at every Mass, not only those whose names are listed.

Or ... you scan the front cover of the Parish Calendar and see what's happening on the parish property, which groups are meeting and where. Even among these, we can accompany them in our faith and with our prayers.

Or ... you look at the listing of the Scripture readings for upcoming Masses each day. I know some people look ahead and check these out; cracking open their trusty Bibles and prayerfully discerning what God is saying to them through these words. Another way to find daily Mass Scriptures is to access [www.usbccb.org](http://www.usbccb.org) for the Daily Scriptures Readings calendar. We can never open and read our Bibles enough. St. Jerome said, "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ."

Or ... you read about what's happening through the parish Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, our ever-active food pantry and its needs, responding to so many people for whom food insecurity and hunger are daily realities. Or ... see what other needs there are or meetings of other faith-filled groups throughout Portland. Of course, the Sentinel Catholic newspaper, found at the church entrances in English and in Spanish, are another way to keep in touch with what's happening in our part of the world.

Or ... you can find names and addresses for ways to reach out and help those in Ukraine who are suffering from Russian aggression.

Or ... you'll find the names for whom flowers are donated during Christmas and Easter seasons.

Wow! All of these are simply more signs of the life of Holy Redeemer parish and how God continues to bless us here. May all of us continue to be a blessing for one another!
