HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. 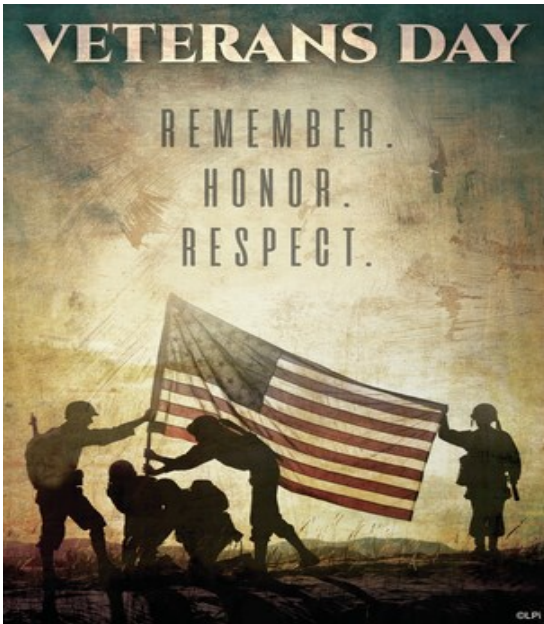

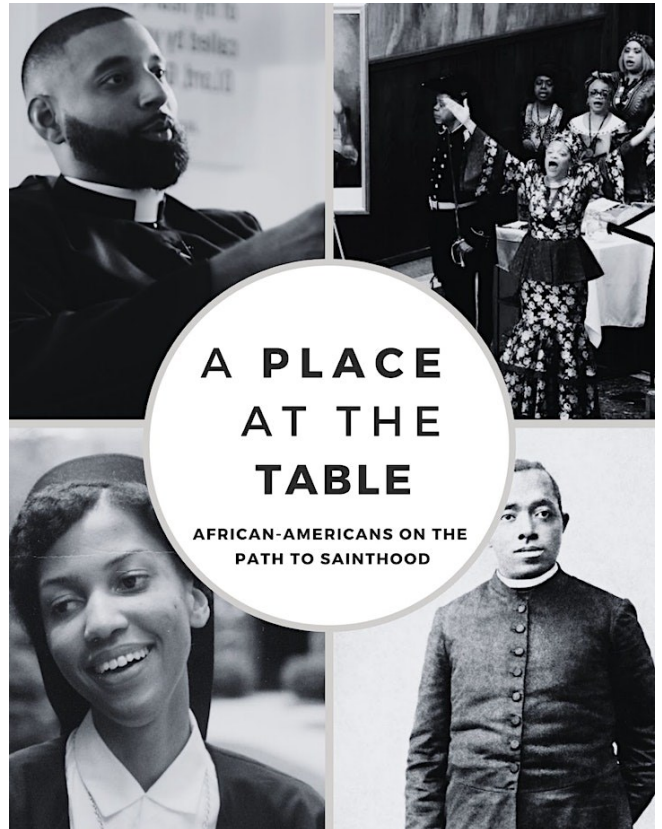

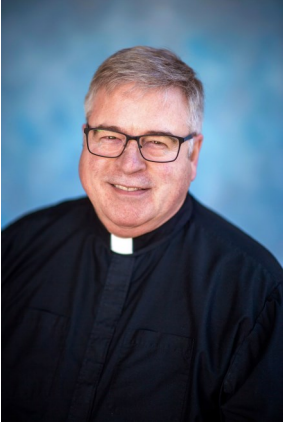

Fr. Michael's Message



“Time is marching on!” And as each day passes, we are one day older. Which simply means we are one day closer to Heaven.

This is the weekend when time changes. We set our clocks to “fall back” one hour as we move out of Daylight Savings Time. Most of our clocks do this automatically now, but there’s some of us - me included - who have to do this by hand. And it’s also the weekend some people show up to Mass an hour early ... because they didn’t change their clocks!

But no matter what Time we are on from one season to the next, we have to trust that we are living in God’s time. Here’s what I mean: we live according to a schedule, a calendar, a clock. We are either early or late for meetings, school, work. This is the way we in North America use time.

A recent comic strip opened with a nod to this experience. One guy tells another: “I have trouble living in the present.” His friend replies, “That’s too bad because the present is a gift, which is why it’s called the present.”

Some cultures see time more as a gift. Instead of forecasting ahead, planning the future, scurrying to make the most of the present moment before it expires, other cultures simply live, they simply live in the present moment; they simply live in the present moment and experience whatever and whoever is in front of them. There’s no sense of a clock ticking or the sand running through the hourglass. There’s a sense of fullness, of purpose, all of which can be lost if we’re living according to the clock.

Our lives in faith, because of the Resurrection, abide by a completely different sense of time. We are living in anticipation of the Kingdom and God has conquered sin and death through the loving sacrifice of our Lord.

So, in our faith as baptized Catholics, who eat the heavenly bread of the Eucharist, we strive to be present to the Lord and to others, in the moment, knowing full well that everything will come about in God’s time. No need for worry, but only trust.

With this in mind, November is designated as **National Vocation Awareness week**. We are invited to pray for and encourage young people to discern a possible vocation to priesthood or religious life. This call is one which serves the world and the Church through an explicitly Christian life of service and vows.

Over the summer, we had two seminarians live with us: Joey Canepa from the Archdiocese and Tyler Kreipke, CSC, one from the Congregation of Holy Cross. Their presence certainly added to our communal life in the rectory but also their exposure to you and the parish was helpful. Such an experience for them helps in the discernment as to where God is calling them. Please continue to keep them in prayer.

Also, November is the month in which we especially remember in prayer all who have died, Saints and sinners, one and all. Please stop by the Altar of Remembrance in the front of the church, feel free to write the names of your departed loved ones in the Book of Remembrance, and offer a prayer for all those pictured. **“Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace!”**
