DO YOU HAVE ENOUGH HEALTHY FOOD FOR YOURSELF AND YOUR FAMILY?

If you are struggling, you are not alone. We can help you get through difficult times with nutritious fresh and canned food from our St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. Located in the church basement off Williams Avenue, we are open Wednesdays and Saturdays from 2:30 to

4:00 pm. All requests are treated confidentially. Another resource is foodfinder.oregonfoodbank.org.

FOOD PANTRY NEEDS: coffee, tea, brown rice, 1# or 5# bags of sugar and juice and box meals (like Hamburger Helper). You can bring these to the rectory or to the Food Room during Wednesday & Saturday hours.

FOR THE WEEK ENDING:

10/21/21 we've served 22 families with \$3,400 in food/rent/utilities. Holy Redeemer Church/School donated 1,247lbs. of food and volunteers offered 38 hours of time. **Thank you for your ongoing sacrifices and love.**

RENT & UTILITY ASSISTANCE:

We are able to provide emergency rent and utility assistance—for those facing utility cutoff or eviction. Assistance is provided to registered parishioners and households within our parish boundaries (N. Ainsworth/ N. Killingsworth to the Columbia River and MLK to NE 22nd Ave.). **We are able to provide this assistance due to the generosity of parishioners.**

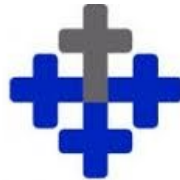
CELEBRATING DOROTHY DAY'S VISION: MINISTERING TO HOMELESS YOUTH IN PORTLAND

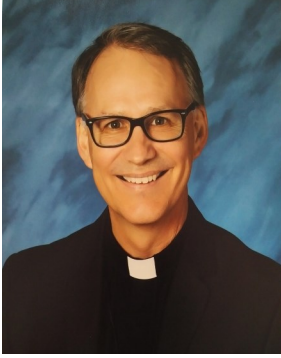

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

When I was a boy, the legendary Mayor Daley of Chicago talked to a room full of reporters. They wanted to talk about corruption in City Hall. Mayor Daley, a daily Mass goer, said, "Look, Jesus Christ has 12 disciples. One denied him and the other betrayed him. He didn't have perfection. You expect it from City Hall?"

I tell this story, because we have this idea that the saints were so different from us, that there is no way that you and I could ever become saints. We are all too aware of our failures and do not see ourselves as God sees us.

Look at the Apostles. They were completely ordinary men and not particularly smart, religious, or virtuous. Yet Jesus saw something in each one of them. He never lost faith in them. He even gave them nicknames, like Peter, the rock. And look what happened to these very ordinary men.

I think of my favorite saints. They were all very human and each had flaws and weaknesses. St. Jerome, for example, had a very bad temper. St. Augustine was a playboy and had a child out of wedlock before his conversion.

St. Patrick wrestled with tremendous inner anxiety after an encounter with Satan when he felt as if a huge stone had fallen on him. The fear of that happening again never left him and made him cry out to Christ whenever it came near.

St. Therese of Lisieux, the nineteenth-century Carmelite nun who died at the age of 24, and left a manuscript describing her "little way" of spirituality, suffered from extreme fears, anxieties, and emotional distress, including at least one nervous breakdown.

What I love most about the saints is that they were very human and full of flaws, just like us. Only they learned that they could no longer count on themselves and could only count on Christ. They learned how to surrender to him.

Now it's your turn. You are so quick to see your weaknesses, failings, and sins. Christ sees your true self, and he has given you a nickname that captures your purpose on this earth. While you have faith in him, his faith in you is stronger. Stop relying on yourself. Surrender to him and become a saint. Above all, be about growing in love each day.

I will end with this quote from St. Therese of Lisieux to give us inspiration: "Everything is a grace, everything is the direct effect of our Father's love - difficulties, contradictions, humiliations, all the soul's miseries, her burdens, her needs - everything, because through them, she learns humility, realizes her weakness. Everything is a grace because everything is God's gift. Whatever be the character of life or its unexpected events - to the heart that loves, all is well."
