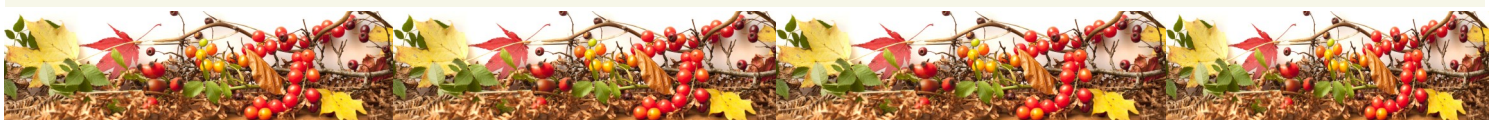

## Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

When I was a kid growing up in northern Indiana, we had tornado warnings with some regularity, especially in the Spring. After hearing the siren my family would huddle together in our basement and my mother would light blessed candles. That is when we kids would grab our huge family Bible and leaf through it, mostly gazing at the beautiful photos of famous religious paintings contained within it.

At the beginning of the Bible was a section written about the rosary by Fr. Patrick Peyton, C.S.C. As a boy, I had no idea that this famous priest was a Holy Cross priest, an order that I would join years later. Fr. Patrick Peyton, known as the “rosary priest,” was famous for praying the rosary with Catholic celebrities in Hollywood, such as Bing Crosby, Loretta Young, and Gregory Peck. He conducted rosary rallies in major cities worldwide and it's estimated that by the time he died in 1992 close to 28 million people had attended them.

His most famous statement was, “The family that prays together, stays together.” Curiously, my own family did not pray the rosary together. I didn't get introduced to it until my best friend's mother was dying when we were both in tenth grade. He and I learned to say it together and that became my favorite way of praying while in high school.

October is the Month of the Rosary. The rosary is primarily a meditation on the mysteries of human salvation in Christ. It is a simple prayer. And the constant repetition and rhythm of the Hail Mary leads one into a meditative state of peacefulness and stillness.

I would like to encourage you to consider taking up the rosary, if you haven't already. And if you can, start praying the rosary with your family. Yes, it feels a bit awkward at first, but it eventually becomes easy to pray with a little practice.

If you are like me, my cellphone is rarely out of my sight. Yet if we can take 15 minutes a day to unplug from social media and pray the rosary, I'm convinced that it will be transformative spiritually for us and for our families.

Fr. Patrick Peyton was declared a Servant of God, and at present is only one miracle shy of being canonized a saint, which would make him the second saint of the Congregation of Holy Cross (after St. Brother Andre Bessette). “The family that prays together, stays together”: Why not put his insight into the unifying power of the rosary to the test?
