HOLY REDEEMER'S SVDP CONFERENCE

"Giving help and hope one person at a time." The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded by a small group of students in Paris in 1835 and now stretches across the globe. Its namesake and patron saint was a sixteenth century priest from Pouy, France who became known as the "Father of the Poor." The Society was unique for its time in that it was formed by lay Catholics, and it offered charity to foreigners as well as non-Catholics. A truly Christian enterprise! Our conference at Holy Redeemer seeks to reflect this Vincentian spirit through our rent and utility assistance program as well as a food pantry, all staffed and funded entirely through volunteers. Our pantry receives food from the parish as well as partner agencies such as the Oregon Food Bank, Safeway, and Nite Hawk Cafe & Lounge. Each conference is governed by a Board of Directors which includes a spiritual advisor and is overseen by the Portland District Council www.svdppdx.org. VOLUNTEERS FOR MONTHLY MEAL SERVICE AT ST. ANDRE BESSETTE DOWNTOWN

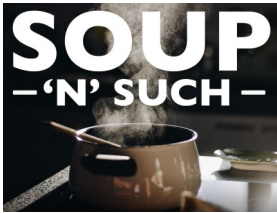
Our Holy Redeemer Conference of St. Vincent de Paul will again be providing a monthly meal service at St. Andre Bessette downtown, in their commercial kitchen. **The time commitment is typically less than 4 hours a month and Holy Redeemer Catholic School Fair Share Hours are available to school families that participate. Holy Redeemer will be hosting the second Fridays of the month, starting in October and our goal is to form a team of about 8 volunteers.** Anyone with experience in restaurants/food carts to help coordinate the preparation, packaging and distribution of the to-go meals would be very appreciated.

The Pastor of St. Andre Bessette will provide an orientation for our volunteers on our first Friday and will explain any safety concerns to help everyone feel confident and assured that clients can be served with dignity and respect. Volunteers will need to be comfortable with using stairs in the work space.

Work starts with the meal preparation 3:00- 4:00pm followed by serving the meal and then of course clean up. At this point, the meals are boxed "to-go" with hopes of moving to "stay and eat" dining room service in the future.

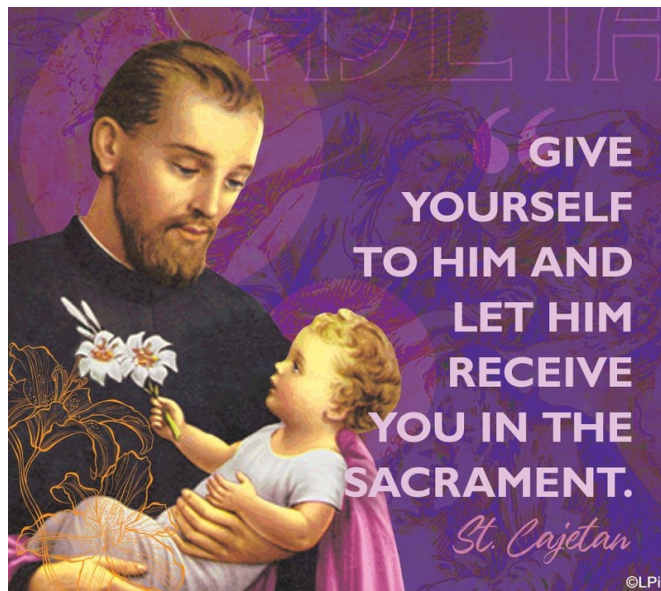

Fr. Cameron's Message



Dear Holy Redeemer Parishioners,

This Sunday is designated in the Catholic Church all over the globe as "World Mission Day." It is a day in which we are reminded of one essential aspect of the Church's very being: to share the good news of the Paschal mystery—Christ's suffering, death and resurrection for our salvation—with all the world, so that people from every nation and culture may be drawn to participate in that very mystery. The special collection taken up in local parishes on this day are directed to the Holy Father for his financial support of missionary activity throughout the world. This year, Pope Francis has selected for the day's theme this bible verse: "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). I would

like to share just a few points from Pope Francis' message to the Church for this mission Sunday.

You shall be my witnesses:

This 'you' is all of us! When we say that the Church is essentially missionary in nature, we are not speaking only (or even primarily) about the institutional hierarchy of bishops and priests and deacons. We are speaking of the entire people of God, the Body of Christ here in this world, and as we are all members of the Body of Christ, we are all called to carry forward Christ's mission of bringing God's love and truth to the world, so that all people might be saved. Pope Francis emphasizes that being a witness is something more than being a teacher. We bear witness by speaking boldly of the great things that God has done for us, yes, but also by living the kind of life that reflects the love of Jesus Christ for all. "In evangelization, then, the example of a Christian life and the proclamation of Christ are inseparable," writes Pope Francis.

In Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth:

There is no corner of this world that is not meant to be touched by God's love and the good news of salvation. In his message, Pope Francis alludes to an important distinction between proselytism and evangelization, which has been a recurring theme in his teaching throughout his papacy: "The disciples are sent not to proselytize, but to proclaim; the Christian does not proselytize." Proselytization always involves some kind of pressure, imposition of power over another, or subjugation in its attempts to make new converts to a religion or a way of life. These practices—which we must acknowledge, have been present at times in Christian missionary activities—only serve to distort the Gospel message. To proclaim is to make an appeal to a person's freedom, to invite them into a new life in Christ—one that ultimately corresponds with the deepest desires of the human heart for holiness, goodness, love and truth.

Power from the Holy Spirit:

It is God's Spirit that stirs up our hearts towards mission. The Spirit awakens in us a desire to joyfully share what we have received with others, and the same Spirit gives us guidance in helping us discern where and how we are called to proclaim Christ with our lives. It is for this reason that Pope Francis emphasizes the constant need to foster a life of prayer, which "allows us to be refreshed and strengthened by the Spirit as the inexhaustible divine source of renewed energy and joy in sharing Christ's life with others. "

Happy World Mission Day! Go forth and be witnesses to God's love in Jesus Christ!
