THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE AMBO



Within the sanctuary, the furnishings are few yet meaningful: altar, presider's chair, tabernacle, crucifix, and ambo. Ambo, you say? What is that?

The ambo is the pulpit, the reader's stand, the table for the Word proclaimed. The ambo comes to us from the Jewish synagogue. There, the Torah was read aloud for the people while the reader stood on a raised platform at a reader's desk, which became our ambo.

Significantly, both the ambo and the altar are twin symbols of the mystery of Christ's Real Presence at Mass. Related to each other so closely, it's best that they are fashioned out of the same materials, like ours are: marble. At the altar, in the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the Lord is present to us in the Eucharistic Feast; in the Liturgy of the Word, the Lord is present to us in the Scriptures, especially the Gospel, for when the Gospel is proclaimed, it is Christ who speaks. Two tables; one mystery, revealed for our redemption on the way to the Kingdom.

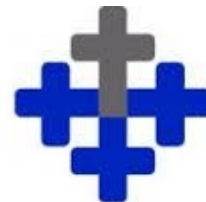

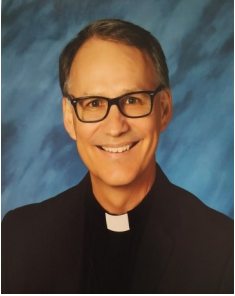

Pastor's Message



Dear Friends:

This coming Friday, October 8, we will initiate our *Weekend of Prayer and Vigilance* at Holy Redeemer and will finish by 6 a.m. on Tuesday, October 12, the day after Columbus Day and Indigenous People's Day on October 11.

As you know, we will be offering Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 8 p.m. to 1 a.m. each of the four nights (Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday nights). It seems most fitting to pray for our society and our world where so many people suffer the effects of widespread social injustice.

In praying for them, we cannot lose sight of those who inflict injustices on others. In other words, we have an opportunity to live the words of Jesus in St. Matthew's gospel: "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor' and 'Hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be sons and daughters of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous" (Matthew 5:44).

I feel deep down that whoever spray painted our church doors felt they were standing up to a perceived injustice, primarily in reaction to the news of abuses and deaths of numerous children who attended indigenous schools in Canada, run in large measure by the Catholic Church. At best, their action was misguided, at worst, it constitutes an attack on a church and has been categorized by the F.B.I. as a bias crime and a federal offense.

In addition to prayer, we will have volunteer sentinels on watch in two-hour shifts from 10p.m. to 6 a.m. throughout the four nights. Our sentinels will be constantly on patrol throughout the parish grounds. We will have sandwiches, snacks, and beverages available to keep our sentinels fortified throughout the night watches.

We are hopeful that there will be no incidents at all. Our approach will be to avoid verbal or physical altercations, should trouble present itself, and to alert the police immediately.

I'm grateful to any of you that can spend some time in prayer or as sentinels any of the evenings from next Friday, October 8, to the following Tuesday morning, October 12. We may sacrifice some sleep for the good of our parish but it is worth it. And if you are not able to come join us, just keeping us all in prayer on occasion will be much appreciated.

God brings grace out of everything, and I know that in some wonderful way God will bring us closer together as a Holy Redeemer family because of all of this!
